Psalm 19:7-11

Sermon Date: June 27, 2010

Prayer:

Spend some time this week thanking the Lord for revealing Himself to us through the Bible. Pray that He would give you a passion for His Word and that He would make clear to you the truth that it contains. Ask that He would stir in you a desire to make the truths of Scripture known to all men.

Scripture:

Read the following passages and write down what they tell us about God’s written Word, the Bible.

Psalm 19:7-11 –

2 Timothy 3:14-17 –

2 Peter 3:14-18 –

Study Questions:

2 Timothy 3:16 tells us that “All Scripture is breathed out by God...” What are the implications of that truth? In what ways does that impact your view of the authority of Scripture?

Do you think your present level of response to the written words of Scripture is an appropriate one? What are some things you can do in order to help make your attitude toward Scripture more like the kind of attitude God wants you to have (Psalm 119:9-16)?

Do you find it difficult to believe everything recorded in Scripture? Why or why not? How does Psalm 19:7-11 encourage you to believe all that He has said in His written Word?

Do you spend time in God’s Word on a regular basis? If so, write down the ways in which your time in the Word has helped you to grow in your faith? If not, is there something you can do to make sure this becomes a priority in your life? Pray that the Lord would give you the strength to remain disciplined in making Scripture a priority in your life.
